- 3 In the first year of JD study, the normal annual study load is 66 credits of JD core courses and JD elective courses taken in the regular semesters (not including the summer semester). Prior approval from the Programme Director is required if a student intend to enrol a course in the June semester of their first-year study. Please write to Ms Jean Ko ([jdstu@hku.hk](mailto:jdstu@hku.hk)) with your personal particulars (Example: Chan Tai Man John, 3035123456, JD1), study plan, justification with supporting documents and the choice of a June semester course, by April 30, 2025, for consideration. If approved, credits earned in the June semester will count towards the total study load for their first-year study. The student will take 72 credits of JD courses in each of their first and second year of studies.
- 4 Courses offered in June semester are intensive courses. Enrolment and the study load will be counted as summer semester courses on academic transcript. Assessment result will only be released in next academic year (i.e., mid-September).
